



Notification to inventors about their designation




- The vast majority of national offices do not inform inventors about their designation.
- Only three offices including the EPO notify inventors about their designation.

Adopted common practice - Notification

- Inventors are not formally notified by patent offices about their designation in a patent application;
- Inventors can instead obtain information about their designation from the applicant, through inspection of the patent register or via file inspection;

Adopted common practice – Inventor data

- Family name, given name(s), country and place of residence, or, if allowed, of employment of designated inventors are entered in the patent register.
- Additional information about inventors' full addresses is not published in the patent register. This is without prejudice to the right of inventors to waive their right to be mentioned, if available.

Rule 19(3) and (4) EPC - Notification

 (3) If the applicant is not the inventor or is not the sole inventor, the European Patent Office shall communicate to the designated inventor the information in the document designating him and the following data: (a) the number of the European patent application; (b) the date of filing of the European patent application; and, if priority has been claimed, the date, State and file number of the previous application; (c) the name of the applicant; (d) the title of the invention; (e) the Contracting States designated. 	(3) deleted
(4) The applicant and the inventor may invoke neither the omission of the communication under paragraph 3 nor any errors contained therein.	(3) deleted

Rule 19(1) EPC - Designation

(1) The request for grant of a European patent shall contain the designation of the inventor. However, if the applicant is not the inventor or is not the sole inventor, the designation shall be filed in a separate document. The designation shall state the family name, given names and full address of the inventor, contain the statement referred to in Article 81 and bear the signature of the applicant or his representative.

The designation shall state the family name, given names and country and place of residence of the inventor, contain the statement referred to in Article 81 and bear the signature of the applicant or his representative.

Implementation at the EPO

- Notice from the European Patent Office dated 22 February 2021 concerning the amendment of Rules 19 and 143 EPC (<u>OJ EPO 2021, A12</u>).
 - The place of residence is the city or other municipality where the inventor permanently resides, and includes the postal code. Place of employment accepted.
 - Rule 19(1) EPC as amended applies to any designation of the inventor filed or rectified on or after 1 April 2021.
 - EPO filing tools have been updated accordingly.
 - Amended Rule 143(1)(g) EPC will enter into force on 1 November 2021 and will apply to all patent applications published in the European Patent Register on or after that date.
